Problem:

- One million Ohioans have a suspended driver's licenses
- There are over three million suspensions
- Under Ohio law, 74 offenses carry either a mandatory or permissive driver's license suspension
- Reinstatement fees—administrative fees—range from\$15 to \$600 each



Progress:

Driver's License Reinstatement Fee Amnesty Pilot Program

- Brought to a lawmaker by a constituent (2018)
- Legislature passed a 6-month pilot program
- 76,000 Ohioans participated
- Average reduction of fees \$789

Permanent Reinstatement Fee Amnesty Program

- 222,716 Ohioans received waiver or reduction
- Average savings of \$612

Non-Compliance Reinstatement Fee Reduction in Budget
