Perhaps some of us may be feeling like Jesus' Disciples may have felt during those dark days preceding the Resurrection. Could it be that we, at times, like the Disciples, need to be in a safe space, all together, for encouragement, support, acceptance?

I invite you to read these words again.

"That evening, the disciples gathered together, and because they were afraid of reprisals from the Jewish leaders, they had locked the doors. But suddenly Jesus appeared among them and said, "Peace to you!"

Then he showed them the wounds of his hands and his side—they were overjoyed to see the Lord with their own eyes! Jesus repeated his greeting, 'Peace to you!" And he told them, 'Just as the Father has sent me, I'm now sending you.'

Then, taking a deep breath, he blew on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. I send you to preach the forgiveness of sins—and people's sins will be forgiven. But if you don't proclaim the forgiveness of their sins, they will remain guilty." (John 20:19-23 TPT)

Jesus, the Crucified and Risen Savior, died for our sins and rose again to give us Hope and Peace and Life. After conquering sin and death, He appeared to the Disciples and many others. His message on that first evening of Resurrection Day was simply this: "Peace be with you. Receive the Holy Spirit. Preach forgiveness. Forgive."



## **Churches Receive VBS Mini-Grants**

Fifteen churches across West Ohio received help with their upcoming VBS programs from the United Methodist Foundation of West Ohio. Thanks to the generosity of a Foundation donor, \$5750 was provided for VBS programs in this year's grant cycle.

Previous support was limited to the former Capitol Area Districts but was recently expanded at the discretion of the donor.

"We're so excited to be able to support so many programs," said Maddy DeWitt, Donor Relations Manager for the Foundation. "59 churches applied – which is incredible! And although we don't have enough funding to support them all, we were able to provide funding to churches in every district this year."

Funds were provided by Ketha Robbins, who established the Clara's Kiddies/Jesse's Vine Endowment with the Foundation in 2017 to support VBS programs in honor of her grandmother and great-grandfather who encouraged her faith. To Ketha, this is what made, and continues to make, VBS so special. In her words, "It is a bookend. It is the start of what a person's spiritual life can become."

#### General Conference

#### **General Information:**

The 2020 General Conference was set to happen in Minneapolis, Minnesota, until the pandemic made it necessary to postpone the quadrennial legislative event until 2024. Delegates from Africa, Europe, Asia and the U.S. will attend the II-day gathering, which could attract as many as 7,500 people. Some 862 delegates, elected from around the world, will gather to set policy and direction for the church, as well as handle other important business.

Meeting every four years, General Conference is the only entity that speaks for the denomination. The United Methodist Book of Discipline, updated every four years, incorporates changes made by the General Conference.

Voting delegates will come from the United States (55.9%), Africa (32%), the Philippines (6%), Europe (4.6%) and concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church (1.5%). **Half will be clergy, half lay.** 

#### Legislation

Following the progress of legislation through the General Conference process can be a challenge. Most issues come before delegates in the form of petitions sent by individuals, groups, annual conferences and governing bodies of general agencies. These appear in the <u>Advance Daily Christian Advocate</u> and on the General Conference website.
