All In Community Local Partnerships

Within the West Ohio Conference, All In Community partners with local reentry coalitions, prison ministry programs, and other faith-based groups to provide a continuum of care during and after an incarceration experience. Local partnerships include:

Capitol Areas Districts:

- <u>Kindway</u> Kindway's programs and services are designed to assist its participants on their journey from incarceration to independence. <u>Kindway EMBARK</u> is an innovative, faithbased prison reentry program serving Central Ohio. UM servants can become navigators with Kindway's EMBARK program at Marion Correctional Institution and the Ohio Reformatory for Women.
- <u>ARCH</u> ARCH (Accompanying Returning Citizens with Hope) Ministry is a ministry of the Society of St. Vincent DePaul of the Columbus Diocese. ARCH raises awareness in faith communities and provides opportunities for community members to help families of the incarcerated and those returning to the community from incarceration with navigation and linkage to local resources, direct assistance, and peer support groups. ARCH recruits business leaders from faith communities into the ARCH Business Alliance, linking them to potential employees.
- 3. Franklin County Office of Justice Policy and Programs (OJPP) The Office of Justice Policy and Programs (OJPP) serves as the Metropolitan County Criminal Justice Services Agency for Franklin County and is directed by oversight of the Franklin County Board of Commissioners and the Franklin County Criminal Justice Planning Board. OJPP has responsibility for all County initiatives regarding Justice Grants (JAG, TITLE II JJDP, VAWA, JMHC, and others), reentry planning and program recommendations, domestic violence/intimate partner violence prevention and services, and national Stepping Up and Data Driven Justice involvement. OJPP also staffs the Franklin County Reentry Advisory Board and represents the County on various local, state, and national organizations, committees, and initiatives.

Foothills District:

- <u>Restored Citizens Network</u> RCN is a community coalition to help those returning from incarceration to the Muskingum County area. This is accomplished through a referral process connecting community social service agencies with those incarcerated or recently released.
- 2. <u>Athens County Reentry Task Force</u> The Athens County Reentry Task Force helps Athens County residents achieve self-sufficiency and independence. The Reentry Task Force is made up of community partners who are working together to help returning neighbors transition back into society and become independent. The Athens County Task Force offers a coordinated approach geared toward building and supporting a range of collaborative community programs to address the barriers to self-sufficiency in an effort to reduce crime, recidivism and improve public safety.



Northwest Plains District:

 <u>St. Mark's Resource Center (Lima)</u> - The Resource Center is focused on helping the citizens of Lima, Ohio, in the fight against poverty. The Resource Center is dedicated to offering a "Hand Up" instead of a hand out. The center is connected to other agencies in the Lima area to help with a wide range of concerns. Staff can answer questions about where to go for life changing help, as well as, offer emergency food assistance. Periodically, class that teach life skills -- such as cooking, finances, resume writing and job seeking -- are offered.

Maumee Watershed & Northwest Plains Districts:

2. <u>The Ridge Project</u> - The RIDGE Project is a Christian, non-profit organization dedicated to empowering generational responsibility in individuals and improving the lives of families throughout the state of Ohio. Our organization believes that strong families produce strong children, who will pass on that legacy of strength to future generations.

Miami Valley District:

- <u>The New Path, Inc</u> New Path's programs and services are generally limited to Miami County and portions of Montgomery County, including Harrison Township and Trotwood. From clothing to car assistances, New Path offers a variety of programs and services for both short-term needs and long-term self-agency.
- 2. <u>Montgomery County Office of Reentry</u> The Montgomery County Office of Reentry works with a variety of community stakeholders to provide programming and services to the men and women who are returning to Montgomery County from state and local prisons and jails. The Montgomery County Reentry Collaborative serves as a community education assembly which promotes reentry provider networking, organizational support via resource building, and long-term sustainability through leveraged partnerships. The collaborative body is comprised of service providers and advocates working cooperatively with the Montgomery County Office of Reentry to promote programs, services, and partnerships that minimize barriers to successful reentry and promote a reduction in recidivism.

Ohio River Valley District:

 <u>Hamilton County Office of Reentry</u> - The Hamilton County Office of Reentry is a client driven referral and support organization that provides services to individuals returning to the community from correctional facilities. HCOR is also a convener of thought leaders in the field of reentry.
