The Gift of Confirmation

The Psalm for this coming Sunday is Psalm 1. I still remember most of it, "Blessed is the man who walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, or sitteth in the seat of scornful. But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in his law doeth he meditate day and night..."



Psalm 1 was one of the many items of scripture and doctrine that I had to memorize (in the KJV!) as a 6th grader in confirmation class. I am surprised not only that I remember most of it, but as I think back to that time, by how seriously I took that experience and how much it meant to me then and has ever since.

I also think of the many students I've had the opportunity to teach in confirmation classes over the years. I have been impressed by their commitment. Even when I've had questions about how seriously they have taken it at any given moment (no, we're not going to play basketball right now) later they have shared about how much the whole process and making their commitment to the church meant to them. Even my own daughter, who had confirmation online and outside due to Covid, recently mentioned that confirmation was meaningful to her faith development. *continue reading...*

The 56th session of the West Ohio Conference will be held May 28 - May 31, again this year at Capital University in Bexley. This will be the first Ohio Episcopal Area annual conference in which Bishop Hee-Soo Jung presides. 


